

Vandalism Prevention Tips

School campuses, especially during warm summer months, can be a temptation for mischievous kids and adults. What can you do to protect your campus from vandalism? Here are a few suggestions:

- ✓ **Make sure your fire and intrusion alarms are working properly. Repair all elements that are malfunctioning.**
- ✓ **Check all lighting on campus. Replace all burned out bulbs. Install lighting in currently dark areas. Consider installing motion sensor lights.**
- ✓ **Don't allow landscaping to provide camouflage for vandals. Cut back weeds and other vegetation around the campus to reduce fire risk and hiding places.**
- ✓ **Ensure all sprinkler heads are protected from breakage to prevent flooding.**
- ✓ **Shut down the gas supply to science rooms when school is out of session.**
- ✓ **Remove garbage cans when school is out of session. Garbage has been used as an ignition source for arson fires.**
- ✓ **Check fences and gates for damage. Make repairs and keep gates locked.**
- ✓ **Post WeTip signs where neighbors can see them. They may see something that can help catch a vandal.**
- ✓ **Keep window coverings closed to hide room contents.**
- ✓ **Store high value equipment (computers, TVs etc.) in secure rooms, preferably without windows.**
- ✓ **If you have surveillance cameras, make sure they are working properly. Post signage around the perimeter of the school alerting would-be vandals to the security systems you have in place.**
